Protocols for Centralia WINTER Athletics

Centralia Facilities

Our Goal: The purpose of these protocols is to create an environment for athletes to compete in a manner that is as safe as possible. We need everyone's cooperation to make this happen!

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- Family, Adult, Senior Citizen and Student passes will be accepted. School issued passes (District, League) will be accepted.
- Centralia athletes will have temperature checked before boarding the bus. We ask visiting teams to do the same.
- Spectators should sit as family cohorts and social distance.
- Spectators will not be allowed near participant groups, or on fields/courts. Only essential personnel will be allowed near participant groups.
- Spectators are expected to self-screen themselves upon entering contests.
- Individuals (spectators or members of a team) with fevers of 100.4 or above, or with flu like symptoms shall not attend a contest.
- Spectators shall sit in their assigned section of the gym for their school.
- All of these spectator guidelines are subject to change based on local conditions.
- We have ordered a pixellot system to live stream home games. If you choose not to come and watch in person, you can subscribe to it for a fee.
- Visiting athletes are strongly encouraged to travel to and from contests in uniform.
- When riding in school buses or vehicles to away contests, all passengers will wear face masks while in the bus or vehicle.
- Upon entering the gym, all athletes and coaches are required to wear masks other than warm up, or participation.
- A room will be available for teams to meet before and after competitions.

BASKETBALL:

- Masks required at all home and away games.
- Only parents of players/managers will be allowed at away league games for OTL and TVL unless schools have more restrictions because of capacity. There will be a "pass list" at the gate for parents to check in.
- For non-league games, we will inform parents/fans on protocols as we get them.
- Temperature checks will be done inside the building at the gate for spectators.
- Limited seating in North gym (secondary gym). Home players' parents sit on south sideline in chairs. Visiting players' parents sit on the stage.
- South gym-main gym, currently spectators are allowed (50% capacity).
- Social distance in both gyms.
- Concessions open at this time. No self-serve lines.
- Visiting teams will clean their bench area before exiting.
- No cheerleaders at away games, home games only.
- Will follow KSHSAA guidelines.

CENTRALIA SCHOOLS SPECTATOR'S CODE OF ETHICS

FOR USE IN ALL ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES

ADOPTED BY THE TWIN VALLEY LEAGUE

Winning is often so important that some people have lost sight of the educational values inherent in athletics/activities. If the full benefit of athletics/activities as an educational tool is to be utilized, schools must immediately concern themselves with spectator sportsmanship.

The playing of a contest should be regarded by the spectators as an art and should be appreciated and enjoyed as such. Respect for our players, coaches/sponsors, and officials, regardless of their own team loyalty, is essential for raising the standards of good sportsmanship.

Ethical consideration for the spectators:

- Recognize the official/judge as a person of integrity and qualification; and respect the decisions accordingly.
- Treat game officials with respect. Do not complain about or argue about calls or decisions during or after an athletic event. The Twin Valley League will not tolerate disrespect to game officials.
 - The Three Strike Rule: If game officials ask school personnel to address a spectator, or if deemed necessary by school administration, for disrespectful conduct before, during, or after a game, school personnel will speak with the spectator. If the conduct continues after this discussion, the spectator will be required to leave the venue immediately and complete the NFHS "Sportsmanship Course" prior to attending the next sporting event. The incident will be recorded by school personnel. If a second incident occurs with the same spectator during the same school year, this individual will be required to leave the venue immediately, complete the NFHS "Sportsmanship Course" prior to attending another sporting event, and will not be able to attend the next sporting event of that season (or the following applicable season if incident occurs at the last contest of the season). If a third incident occurs, the spectator will be required to leave the venue immediately and will no longer be able to attend further athletic events during the applicable sports season and possibly remaining applicable sports seasons during the school year. This policy applies to home and away events.
 - Further disciplinary action and requirements may be deemed necessary by administration as situations arise. If an offense is deemed more serious than a 'first strike' offense, additional penalties may be determined by administration or the action may be deemed as a "second strike" offense, for example. This list of offenses is not all inclusive.
 - "Be the solution, not the problem."
- Refrain from creating disturbances which would be detrimental to the flow of the contest and/or to the safety of the participants involved.
- Refrain from harassment, profane language, or ostentatious behavior in respect to participants and coaches/sponsors.
- Become familiar with the rules of the games in order to enjoy it more and to understand the decisions made by the official.
- Exhibit team loyalties and support without negative action toward their opponents or officials of the contest.
